

Visit to a Maasailand Church

Lynn and Dori Cazier have been working as CMF missionaries in Kenya since 2003. Here's a story from a recent newsletter:

Recently, we worshiped with the Inkiito congregation in its new building and witnessed the marriage ceremony of three couples during the morning service. All have been together for various years and have children. One couple had been married traditionally, one had a civil marriage, and one was married in the church. However, none were married by a licensed pastor to receive the official Kenyan marriage license. A licensed pastor was brought in from another area to perform the weddings. How godly and beautiful was the ceremony – a great witness to the community as some of the unchurched watched through the open windows.

The day before, the congregation dedicated its new building and also ordained pastors and elders. What a memorable weekend for them, celebrating and working to feed several hundred people both days by cooking in huge pots over wood fires under the trees!

What is also amazing about the Inkiito congregation and the one at Kumpa is that both were in the area of Maasailand hardest hit by the severe drought more than a year ago. The people remained faithful to God, pulled together, and were able to raise their share of the funds for each to construct a new church building. Another powerful witness to their communities! Yes, God is faithful!
